

He Has Risen! Text: Matthew 28:1-10 April 8, 2023

Big Idea: Jesus has risen from the grave, you must believe in Him to have life.

Context is key!

Question #1 (Context)

- Ask Yourself: What is going on in the text?
- a) What is the setting and what is happening?
- b) Who are the main characters?
- c) Are there any words/phrases that are repeated?

Question #2 (Context)

Ask Yourself: What does the text says about God and about me? a) Is God saying or showing something about Himself? If so, what? b) Do the words in the text predict, prophesy or picture something about Jesus? If so, what? c) Is God saying or showing something about us? If so, what? d) How does the text point to my need for Jesus? How?

Question #3 (Context)

Ask Yourself: What are the principles, commands or promises given? a) What is the overall theme of the text? (Hint: See the 'Big Idea' above!) b) Does the passage include any promise from God? If so, what?

Question #4 (Context)

Ask Yourself: What is the application? a) What is one specific way I can live by these truths, or trust in these promises today? b) What is the next step that I need to take to see this happen?

Jesus has risen from the dead...

Point 1: The TRUTH is REVEALED: "Come and See!" (vv. 1-7)

Question: The evidence for the resurrection is clear. Will you see the truth and believe it?

Question #5

The truth revealed...

A DEMONSTRATION of Power (vv. 1-4)

a) **Rd vv. 1-4:** How does the women coming to anoint Jesus' body support the truth of the resurrection?

- b) What did the Jews and Romans do to ensure that the disciples couldn't steal the body?
- c) What 2 signs did God do to overcome their efforts and show the truth of the resurrection?
- d) What are ways God promises to demonstrate His power through His people today? (Use Scripture)
- e) What are some ways God has demonstrated His power in your life this past year?

Question #6

The truth revealed...

A <u>DECLARATION</u> of Proof (vv. 5-7)

a) Rd vv. 5-7: What two truths does the angel declare that support the truth of the resurrection?

b) Why is the truth that Jesus had a bodily resurrection crucial to the truth of the gospel?

c) Give examples from Scripture that prove Jesus rose in body and not as a spirit.

d) How does the truth of Jesus' bodily resurrection give us confidence and hope today as we live as His witnesses?

Jesus has risen from the dead... **Point 2: The** <u>**TRUTH</u>** is <u>**CONFIRMED**</u>: **"Don't Be Afraid!"** (vv. 8-10) *Question: The truth about Jesus is confirmed. How will you respond to Him*?</u>

Question #7

- a) Read v. 9: How did the women respond when Jesus met them on the road?
- b) Give examples from Scripture of what God says a life of true worship to Him is to look like.
- c) What area(s) of your life do you worship (ie-ascribe greater worth to) other things over Christ?
- d) What is it you really want from those things that you believe you won't have in Christ?
- e) How does the gospel fulfill that desire you're trying to fill with those other things? (Use Scripture)
- f) What is a next step you can take this week in His power to grow in your worship of Christ in those areas?

Question #8

a) What is the gospel?

b) Now, write it out again in 1-2 sentences.

Prayer Application

Spend time as a group/in accountability in prayer...

- a) <u>ADORATION</u> before Christ: Declare what He has done through His death \otimes resurrection.(Use verses)
- b) <u>CONFESSION</u> to Christ: Confess areas of unbelief in His resurrection power through the gospel.
- c) <u>THANKSGIVING</u> to Christ: Thank Jesus for saving you and empowering you to follow Him.
- d) <u>SUPPLICATION</u> to Christ: Pray for increasing worship of Christ in each area of your life and an increasing witness for Him through His resurrection power.
