

## I Will Set My Heart on God! Text: 1 Samuel 16:1-13 October 7, 2023

Big Idea: I will set my heart on God!

Context is key!

## **Question #1 (Context)**

- Ask Yourself: What is going on in the text?
- a) What is the setting and what is happening?
- b) Who are the main characters?
- c) Are there any words/phrases that are repeated?

## Question #2 (Context)

Ask Yourself: What does the text says about God and about me? a) Is God saying or showing something about Himself? If so, what?

- b) Do the words in the text predict, prophesy or picture something about Jesus? If so, what?
- c) Is God saying or showing something about us? If so, what?
- d) How does the text point to my need for Jesus? How?

### **Question #3 (Context)**

Ask Yourself: What are the principles, commands or promises given?

- a) What is the overall theme of the text?
- b) Does the passage include any promise from God? If so, what?

### **Question #4 (Context)**

Ask Yourself: What is the application?

- a) What is one specific way I can live by these truths, or trust in these promises today?
- b) What is the next step that I need to take too see this happen?

# Point 1: <u>HEAVY HEART</u>: Receive Hope! (vv. 1-4a)

### Question #5

"Before seeing man with a heart for God, we see a God who has a heart for a man!"

- a) Rd. vv. 1-4: How does knowing that God has a heart for man, give us hope?
- b) What does living out this hope look like in the situations you are facing right now that have led to a heavy heart? Support with Scripture.

### Point 2: CONFUSED HEART: Receive Wisdom! (vv. 4b-12)

"You and I both have limited points of view. We have limited experience, limited understanding, limited knowledge, and we make mistakes...But GOD is not limited as we are limited."-John Woodhouse **Ouestion #6** 

- a) Rd. vv. 6-12: What characteristics was Samuel looking for in the next King of Israel?
- b) What characteristics was God looking for?
- c) Which characteristics are you most likely to use? Why?
- d) What is the danger of thinking our limited understanding is the whole picture?

## Question #7

- a) Discuss, with support from Scripture, what it means to be a man/woman after God's heart.
- b) How does the gospel empower us to increasingly be after God's heart?
- c) Spend time as a group in prayer for hearts that go hard after the Lord.

# Point 3: <u>HUMBLE</u> <u>HEART</u>: Receive Courage! (vv. 11-13) Question #8

- a) Rd vv. 11-13: Where was David when God called him?
- b) How do we know that David's heart was humble before the Lord?
- c) Why was God's choice unexpected?
- d) What areas do you struggle to walk in humility before the Lord? Why those?
- e) What fruit(s) become evident when you are walking in pride in those situations?
- f) What are you thinking in those moments?
- g) What is it that you really want?

#### Question #9

Recall: The Old Testament points to Jesus, and the New Testament reveals Him.

Discuss how does the life of David point to the life of Jesus?

### **Prayer Application**

Spend time as a group/in accountability in prayer...

- a) REVERENCE before God: Jesus, you are\_\_\_\_
- b) <u>HUMILITY</u> before God: Confess  $\otimes$  repent of areas that are not after God's heart.
- c) THANKSGIVING to God: Jesus, thank Your heart for me as shown through\_\_\_\_\_.
- d) <u>SUPPLICATION</u> to God: Jesus, please strengthen my heart for you in\_\_\_\_\_\_.
