

Big Idea: God will always be faithful, so live by faith in Him alone.

Context is key!

#### Question #1 (Context)

- Ask Yourself: What is going on in the text?
- a) What is the setting and what is happening?
- b) Who are the main characters?
- c) Are there any words/phrases that are repeated?

## Question #2 (Context)

Ask Yourself: What does the text says about God and about me?

- a) Is God saying or showing something about Himself? If so, what?
- b) Do the words in the text predict, prophesy or picture something about Jesus? If so, what?
- c) Is God saying or showing something about us? If so, what?
- d) How does the text point to my need for Jesus? How?

### Question #3 (Context)

Ask Yourself: What are the principles, commands or promises given?

- a) What is the overall theme of the text?
- b) Does the passage include any promise from God? If so, what?

Living by faith means that no matter, you will...

### Point 1: <u>REJOICE</u> in the <u>LORD</u> (vv. 17-18)

*Question: Faith declares, "You are my greatest desire, Lord!" Will you take joy in Him?* **Question #4** 

- a) Rd vv. 17-18: What is Habakkuk describing in v. 17?
- b) Describe what this would look like today for you.
- c) In spite of all the loss, where does Habakkuk land by faith in the Lord? Where do you land? Why?
- d) What does it mean to rejoice in the Lord and take joy in Him above all else?
- e) Why is taking your joy in the Lord, crucial for living with steadfast faith in this world?

#### Point 2: <u>RELY</u> on the <u>LORD</u> (v. 19)

*Question: Faith declares, "You are my strength, Lord!" Will your confidence be in Him?* **Question #5** 

- a) Rd v. 19: Even though his situation hasn't changed, where does Habakkuk place His confidence?
- b) Describe what the Name "God, the Lord" means.
- c) Based on question 'b', why is living with dependence on the Lord essential if you are to live with courageous faith?
- d) What thing(s) are you most tempted to put your strength/confidence in that are not the Lord?
- e) Spend time repenting of putting your confidence/strength in those things; and ask the Lord for a deeper faith to rely on Him and put your confidence in Him alone.

### Question #6

- a) Describe Habakkuk's journey of faith from 1:1-3:19. Where did he start? Where did he end up? How did he get there?
- b) Is this where you normally end up in the trial? Why or why not?
- c) What lessons was God teaching Habakkuk (and us) about living by faith in God's nature, His way and His works?
- c) How does the gospel empower us to live with courageous faith in the Lord?
- d) Spend time in prayer repenting of your unbelief in God's faithfulness, and asking the Lord for an
- *"even if\_\_\_\_\_\_ should not happen, yet I will rejoice in the Lord"* faith in Him.
