### Question #2 (Context)

Ask Yourself: What does the text says about God and about me?

- a) Is God saying or showing something about Himself? If so, what?
- b) Do the words in the text predict, prophesy or picture something about Jesus? If so, what?
- c) Is God saying or showing something about us? If so, what?
- d) How does the text point to my need for Jesus? How?

#### Question #3 (Context)

Ask Yourself: What are the principles, commands or promises given?

- a) What is the overall theme of the text?
- b) Does the passage include any promise from God? If so, what?

#### Question #4

- a) Rd vv. 17-18: What is Habakkuk describing in v. 17?
- b) Describe what this would look like today for you.
- c) In spite of all the loss, where does Habakkuk land by faith in the Lord? Where do you land? Why?
- d) What does it mean to rejoice in the Lord and take joy in Him above all else?
- e) Why is taking your joy in the Lord, crucial for living with steadfast faith in this world?

<ul> <li>Question #5</li> <li>a) Rd v. 19: Even though his situation hasn't changed, where does Habakkuk place His confidence?</li> <li>b) Describe what the Name "God, the Lord" means.</li> <li>c) Based on question 'b', why is living with dependence on the Lord essential if you are to live with courageous faith?</li> <li>d) What thing(s) are you most tempted to put your strength/confidence in that are not the Lord?</li> <li>e) Spend time repenting of putting your confidence/strength in those things; and ask the Lord for a deeper faith to rely on Him and put your confidence in Him alone.</li> </ul>

What keeps you from believing that God will always be faithful? b) How does the gospel empower us to live with courageous faith in the Lord? c) Spend time in prayer repenting of your unbelief in God's faithfulness, and asking the Lord for an "even if should not happen, yet I will rejoice in the Lord" faith in Him.
