HOW TO USE

- 1. Each page has a guide with different sections to go through each devotional thoughtfully with your family.
- 2. Open in prayer together or choose one family member to pray.
- 3. Worship: Spend some time as a family in worship as you prepare to open the Word. See if you can think of a song using the worship section prompts. Use the song you choose to sing or listen to as a family, or have each family member pick a song using the prompts.
- **4. Bible Reading Passage & Discuss:** Read as a family and go through the questions together.
- **5.** Activity Pages: Give your child the activity page to fill out as you are reading. Read over the activity page before starting the reading of the day so your child knows what to listen for carefully.
- 6. Complete the weekly craft and/or memory verse. Colour in the memory verse page and practice throughout the week. See which family members can recite the verse when you gather for the next devotional.
- 7. If your child doesn't understand or know something, that's okay! Leave room for discussion for them to ask questions so you can further help guide them to understand the gospel. Encourage the wonder and awe of the Lord!
- 8. Close in prayer as a family.

WEEK : AN ANCIENT PROPHECY



Open with Prayer:

Ask the Lord for wisdom and focus as you begin today's devotional.

Worship:

Can you find a song that uses any of the names for Jesus used in verse 6 (Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace)? Use this song to worship the Lord before you begin.

Family Bible Reading Passages For Today:



ISAIAH 9:1-7 & ISAIAH 40:1-5

The first week of this devotional begins with Isaiah's prophecy of the coming birth of Christ. The dark days for Israel had begun as Zebulun and Naphtali were the first to suffer as God allowed them to be overrun by the Assyrian invasion. They had hope in the coming of the Messiah and the Light He would bring to them. We see an anticipation for Jesus' arrival on earth as Isaiah's prophecies bring encouragement and comfort.

Reading through this passage in Isaiah points us forward to the hope for people by the birth of a child. "For to us a child is born, to us a son is given," sent as a Saviour for the world. Isaiah is the beginning of the hope found in the birth of Jesus and is the very start of our Christmas story, giving us a glimpse into what is to come! This passage is a centerpiece to all of the Christmas prophecies and is important to us because Isaiah prophesied the Messiah's

Around 700 years before Jesus was even born, God shared with Isaiah about the coming of Jesus to tell to the Israelites.

Isaiah is quoted in the New Testament over 65 times! This is way more than any other Old Testament prophet.

birth. It was all fulfilled by Jesus, showing us later the Messiah had been born!

Discuss:

- In Isaiah 9:2 it says they had seen a great light. What was the light they were talking about? (Hint: Check 2 Corinthians 4:4 to help you!)
- 2. Look at Isaiah 9:2. What contrasts do you see?
- **3.** Write down the names of God listed in verse 6. What do they mean?
- 4. How do you see Jesus as light or any of the names - listed in your life?
- In Isaiah 40:1-5 it talks of God being a comfort and preparing the way for Jesus. How could God's people find comfort in this passage of the prophet Isaiah? Have you ever found comfort in God or need to find comfort in God this week? Share with your family.

Prayer:

Use the prayer prompts below to say a prayer to close your time.

- → Use words of praise to worship God for who He is.
- → Thank God for His prophecies coming to pass & His faithfulness.
- → Praise God as He hears and cares for His people.
- → Who do you know that is still walking in 'darkness' that needs Jesus' light that you can pray for today?



Jesus would be a great light for the people walking in darkness. Isaiah shared this with people to give them hope!



WEEK 2: AN ANGEL VISIT FOR MARY & JOSEPH



Open with Prayer:

Ask the Lord for wisdom and focus as you begin today's study.

Worship:

Can you find a worship song that has the name 'Mary,' 'Joseph,' or 'Immanuel' in it?

Family Bible Reading Passages For Today:



MATTHEW 1:18-25 (Joseph's Story) LUKE 1:26-38 (Mary's Story)

Our second week zooms into the lives of both Mary and Joseph as they find out they are going to be the mother and father of baby Jesus. We see the beginning of the prophecy starting to be fulfilled in these pages as Mary's pregnancy through the Holy Spirit is a surprise to them both! A miracle is taking place and we see the Lord at work continuing to reveal His plan to us, Mary, and Joseph. Could this be from the prophecy from so long ago? Mary and Joseph get a front row seat to the Holy Spirit making a way for God to come to the world through the human form of Jesus as a baby! Read both stories this week so you can get perspective of each Joseph and Mary's experiences as the Lord shares the exciting news with them through the angel visits! This passage is important to us because it shows us how God divinely orchestrated the birth of Jesus through the Holy Spirit because of His love for us.



Jesus is the Son of God, not Son of Joseph "Jesus" (see verse 25; Luke 1:31) actually means "Saviour".

Discuss:

 How did Mary become pregnant? (Matthew 1:18/Luke 1:35)

This is one of only a few angelic visitations in the New Testament. Most angel visits were associated with Jesus' birth (Matthew 1:20).

- Who appeared to Joseph? Why? (Matthew 1:19-20)
- In both Mary and Joseph's stories, we see the name of the child given and the reason for this specific name. What was the name and the reasonings? (Matthew 1:21 & Luke 1:32)
- 4. Read Isaiah 7:14. Can you find this Scripture in the Matthew passage? Why do you think Isaiah 7:14 is included here?
- **5.** How do you think you might have felt if an angel appeared to you and gave you special instructions?
- How did Mary respond when the angel gave her special instructions? (Luke 1:38)

Prayer:

Use the prayer prompts below to say a prayer to close your time.

- → Use your words of praise to worship God for who He is.
- → Thank God for His power and His Word always holding true.
- → Ask for God to help you have a servant's heart toward Him as Mary & Joseph did.
- → Praise the Holy Spirit for actively being at work in believer's daily lives.





²⁰ But as he considered these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. ²¹ She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." Matthew 1:20-21

WEEK 3: PREPARING FOR JESUS - ELIZABETH'S STORY

Open with Prayer:

Ask the Lord for wisdom and focus as you begin today's study.

Worship:

Can you find a worship song that reminds you of God's miracles? Use this song to worship the Lord before you begin.

Family Bible Reading Passages For Today:



LUKE 1:57-80 (you can check out these other Bible passages about John the Baptist. - JOHN 1:6-9, JOHN 1:15, MARK 1:1-8)

Last week we read that the angel told Mary she would become pregnant and so would her cousin Elizabeth. Another baby born fulfilling prophecy yet again, clearly has a special calling. Giving the baby boy a new name - John - we see how the Lord will use him in preparation for the coming of Jesus. John played a big role in preparing the hearts of God's people for Jesus. He reminded them of who was to come and got them ready by being a messenger for God. He cleared the way for Jesus to come fulfill the longing of the promised Saviour and stirred excitement and hope for God's people.

This week we will glance into the story of Elizabeth and the birth and plan for John the Baptist to see how it ties into God's plan and the birth of Jesus.This passage is important

Zechariah lost his voice when he saw a vision of the temple. He got it back when he wrote down that the baby's name was 'John'!

Elizabeth was older so no one thought she could have a baby. It was a miracle!



because it shows another miracle birth, of John, who would later prepare the way for Jesus telling others about the Messiah to come. John's birth fulfilled the prophecy about the Messiah bringing hope to all.

Discuss:

- 1. What was Elizabeth's baby to be named?
- 2. What did Elizabeth call the baby instead?
- **3.** Why were her relatives confused by the name Elizabeth wanted to use?
- 4. What happened after 'John' was written on the writing tablet that made the neighbours fear and realize the baby was part of God's plan?
- Zechariah gave a prophecy at the end of our reading today. What was God's plan for the baby?

Prayer:

Use the prayer prompts below to say a prayer to close your time.

- → Use your words of praise to worship God for who He is.
- → Praise the Lord for His miracles.
- → Bring any hard situations you need to trust the Lord more in to His feet in prayer.
- Thank God for caring about the details just like how He prepared the way for Jesus through John the Baptist.



WEEK 4:

JESUS' BIRTH

Open with Prayer:

Ask the Lord for wisdom and focus as you begin today's study.

Worship:

This week as we reflect on the birth of our Saviour, worship as a family by picking your favourite songs surrounding Jesus' birth.

Family Bible Reading Passages For Today: LUKE 2:1-20)

The weeks of anticipation leading up to Jesus' birth are finally here! Read through the passage slowly and several times this week as we marvel at the humility of the Lord coming to earth: not as a high priest or king, but as a humble baby. How wonderful and sweet this time of year is as we see the promise of hope delivered the day Jesus Christ came into the world as a baby. The mystery is revealed in these coming pages and we see Christ being exalted by the angels and heavenly choirs. Rejoice! The announcement of the good news, a hope for all people, is wrapped up in this passage! This passage is important to us because Isaiah's Christmas prophecy has now come to pass and we see that God is faithful and in control. He has sent His Son into the world to bring us light, love, hope, and joy in the midst of darkness our Saviour is finally here!

Why were there no rooms in the inns? A lot of people were returning to Bethlehem to register



for the census, so this could be the reason.

Discuss:

- 1. Why were Mary and Joseph travelling to Bethlehem?
- 2. How did the shepherds react when the angel appeared to them?
- 3. What was the message the angels gave to the shepherds? Why do you think they praised God?
- 4. After the shepherds had seen Jesus, what did they do?
- 5. Why do you think people were excited about the birth of baby Jesus?

Prayer:

Use the prayer prompts below to say a prayer to close your time.

- → Use your words of praise to worship God for who He is.
- → God made a plan from the beginning to rescue us from our sins. Rejoice and praise God for sending Jesus as a baby and Jesus as our Saviour!
- \rightarrow How do you see the trinity in this story of Jesus' birth? Thank God and praise God. Jesus, and the Holv Spirit for each of their roles in Jesus' birth.



WEEKLY CHALLENGE: MEMORIZE LUKE 2:10-11

We hope you enjoyed journeying through the excitement, prophecies, and birth of Jesus Christ this season.
