Being Nothing, Owning Everything! Text: Matthew 5:1-3 February 15, 2025

Big Idea: Happiness begins in ruins and ends in Glory!

Context is key! Question #1 (Context)

Ask Yourself: What is going on in the text?

- a) What is the setting and what is happening?
- b) Who are the main characters?
- c) Are there any words/phrases that are repeated?

Question #2 (Context)

Ask Yourself: What does the text says about God and about me?

- a) Is God saying or showing something about Himself? If so, what?
- b) Do the words in the text predict, prophesy or picture something about Jesus? If so, what?
- c) Is God saying or showing something about us? If so, what?
- d) How does the text point to my need for Jesus? How?

Question #3

Discuss this quote from Martin Lloyd-Jones: "The glory of the gospel is that when the Church is absolutely different from the world, she invariably attracts it." Do you agree? Why or why not?

Point 1: REVISE your DEFINITION of HAPPINESS!

Question #4

- a) What is your definition of what happiness/blessing is?
- b) Rd Matthew 5:1-12: How does God define happiness/blessing?
- c) In light of the truth of part 'b', why is it impossible to create your own happiness by your efforts to achieve success or status, gain possessions?

Question #5

Note: Please use your fruit to root diagram for the following question.

- a) What place(s) are you trying to seek happiness from right now that isn't God?
- b) What fruit(s)/evil behaviour result from you trying to pursue it from that place but not getting it?
- c) What lies are you believing that lead you to pursue it from that and not the Lord?
- d) What is the worldly treasure that you really want from pursuing that?
- e) What gospel treasure are you forfeiting (and as such, God's blessing), by pursuing that worldly treasure?
- f) What truth must replace the lies if you are to live with true happiness in Jesus?
- g) What fruit/good behaviour will replace the evil behaviour as you pursue the treasure of Jesus over the treasure of the world?
- h) Spend time in prayer for one another in these areas, repenting of the sinful fruit, lies \otimes roots, and asking the Lord for faith in and obedience to His gospel treasure, truth and fruit.

Point 2: REJOICE in being NOTHING before GOD! (v. 3a)

Question #6

- a) Rd. v. 3a: What does "poor in spirit" mean?
- b) Why must this be the foundation for all true happiness in the Lord?
- c) Rd. Isaiah 66:1-5: How does Isaiah display a posture of being poor in spirit before God?
- d) How come poverty of spirit, must precede all true humility?
- e) What do we really deserve? What happens when we think we deserve better than we have?
- f) Where are you thinking you are entitled to more than what you have right now? Repent and rejoice in the Lord!

Question #7

- a) How does remembering the gospel lead us to a place of being poor in spirit/humble before God?
- b) List some things that Jesus took on Himself on the cross that you deserved.
- c) Spend time testifying to what you have received from Jesus by grace through the cross. Here's a good start: "I deserved____ but now I received____" OR "I was____ but now I am____".

Point 3: REJOICE that you POSSESS all THINGS! (v. 3b)

Question #8

- a) What is the difference between the present kingdom of God and the future kingdom of God?
- b) Rd Revelation 21:1-8: Describe the future kingdom that awaits all true believers.
- c) How does living with this eternal/kingdom perspective, keep us happy/satisfied in Jesus now, and happy in the eternal hope that we have in Him for the life to come?
- d) What are you most looking forward to about heaven? (Besides the presence of Jesus!)
