

Faithful in Discernment
Text: Revelation 2:18-29
November 1, 2025

Big Idea: Jesus commands His Word be upheld in His Church, so we must guard it fervently.

Context is key!

Question #1 (Context)

Ask Yourself: What is going on in the text?

- a) What is the setting and what is happening?
- b) Who are the main characters?
- c) Are there any words/phrases that are repeated?

Question #2 (Context)

Ask Yourself: What does the text say about God and about me?

- a) Is God saying or showing something about Himself? If so, what?
- b) Do the words in the text predict, prophesy or picture something about Jesus? If so, what?
- c) Is God saying or showing something about us? If so, what?
- d) How does the text point to my need for Jesus? How?

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Point 1: GUARDS the PERSPECTIVE of Jesus (v. 18)

Question: Jesus sees the sin, and will lovingly confront it. Are you living with His perspective?

Question #3

- a) **Rd v. 18:** What is Jesus telling the church about who He is by describing Himself this way?
- b) Why was this picture of Jesus essential to give to the church in Thyatira?
- c) How should this picture of Jesus impact how we live today regardless whether we are in front of others or not?
- d) How should this picture of Jesus impact our view of sin?
- e) What sin(s) are you currently tolerating in your life that are hindering your purity and that of the church? Spend time in repentance before the Lord for these.

Question #4

- a) Why is the judgment and confrontation of sin in our lives such a loving work of Jesus towards us?
- b) Why is it hard to see the Lord's confrontation of our sin as a loving thing towards us?
- c) How should knowing this shape how we respond to His loving confrontation from His Word as you abide in it, and through the other members in the Body of Christ?
- d) Spend time in prayer repenting of any prideful defensiveness that you have displayed when the Lord confronted you in your sin. Ask the Lord for a greater humility and faith to receive it from Him.

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Point 2: **GUARDS** the **TEACHING** of Jesus (vv. 19-25)

Question: Jesus commands that we guard His Word in belief and practice. Are you?

Question #5

- a) **Rd vv. 19-25:** What did Jesus commend the church for? What did He critique them for?
- b) **Rd John 14:15:** What are some signs/fruits that reveal when our idea of 'loving someone' has gone beyond the boundaries of what God says love is to look like?
- c) When are you most tempted to tolerate or give permission to sin in the name of 'love' and not speak the truth in love to them?
- d) What is it you really want in those moments from that person? What gospel treasure(s) are you not believing in those moments? (Use your fruit to root diagram as needed).
- e) How should believing that gospel treasure change how you respond in those situations (ie-Fruit)?
- f) Spend time in prayer for a greater first love for Jesus and faith to believe that treasure of the gospel you are struggling with.

Question #6

- a) **In vv. 20-25:** What two ways do we see in these verses that we must guard the teaching of God's Word in our lives, homes and in the church?
- b) Compromised theology leads to compromised morality. Why is this the case?
- c) What area(s) are you tempted to compromise on God's Word in your life, home and in the church?
- d) Discuss some next steps you can take starting this week to guard the teaching of God's Word in those areas?

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Point 3: GUARDS the PROMISE of Jesus (vv. 26-29)

Question: Jesus will reward faithfulness. Will you guard His promise in your heart?

Question #7

- a) **Rd vv. 26-29:** What two rewards does Jesus promise to give to those who stay faithful to Him to the end?
- b) Review the rewards Jesus promises to give to the other churches we've studied so far (Ephesus, Smyrna and Pergamum). Write them all down. Now, discuss as a group the rewards that Jesus is ready to give to the one who overcomes in Him. Which ones stand out for you the most? Why those ones? Does this increase your longing for heaven? If so, why?
- c) Now, write down and share how this eternal perspective must shape your daily life in standing firm in the Lord and His Word (ex-in your home, workplace, relationships, church, etc.).
- d) Spend time in praise and prayer as a group for the hope we have in Jesus through the gospel!
